Determination and Notice of Intent to Perform Injury Assessment

Trustees:

Pursuant to the Natural Resource Trustee Memorandum of Agreement for the Portland Harbor Superfund Site, the Natural Resource Trustees (Trustees) for the Portland Harbor Superfund Site (Site) established a Trustee Council with the authority to conduct activities associated with a natural resource damage assessment (NRDA) for the Site. The Trustee Council consists of one representative from each of the Trustees listed above.

Under the direction of the Trustee Council, the attached Determination and Notice of Intent to Perform Injury Assessment has been prepared for the Site. This Determination and Notice of Intent was developed for consideration by the trustee Authorized Officials. The Trustee Council has determined that proceeding with an Injury Determination is appropriate at this time to acquire the information necessary to facilitate early settlement opportunities which, if fully successful, could 1) eliminate the need for subsequent damage assessment and litigation costs; 2) preserve restoration options which might be lost through land development or other habitat modifications; and 3) implement early restoration projects that could minimize potential future lost uses.

Upon adoption by the Authorized Officials, the Trustee Council, through its Chairman, will provide the attached Determination and Notice of Intent to the potentially responsible parties for the Site.

Determination and Notice of Intent to Perform Injury Assessment - Portland Harbor

Notice is hereby given that the Portland Harbor Natural Resource Trustee (Trustee's), based on the Trustee Council's Pre-Assessment Screen (PAS) regarding potential natural resource injury and damage potentially caused by hazardous substances released from the Portland Harbor facilities of the Potential Responsible Parties (PRPs) noticed herein, have made the following determinations:

- A discharge of oil or release of hazardous substance has occurred. Release of appreciable quantities of petroleum compounds, organochlorine pesticides, PCBs, volatile and semi-volatile organic compounds, solvents, metals, and other materials listed in the PAS are documented for the Portland Harbor Superfund site, and have been released over a long period of time.
- 2) Natural resources for which a State or Federal agency or Indian Tribe may assert trusteeship under CERCLA have been or are likely to have been adversely affected by the discharge or release. Natural resources over which the State and Federal agencies and Indian Tribes may assert trusteeship with respect to the Portland Harbor site have been and are likely to continue to be adversely impacted. Existing field data indicate that hazardous substance concentrations in sediment and tissue spatially coincide or are elevated near areas with known releases from industrial facilities or other documented sources.
- 3) The quantity and concentration of the discharged oil or released hazardous substances is sufficient to potentially cause injury to those natural resources. Tissue samples from Portland Harbor contain hazardous materials at concentrations that exceed concentrations associated with injury in sediment, water, fish, bird eggs, and other natural resources.
- 4) Data sufficient to pursue an assessment are readily available or likely to be obtained at reasonable cost. Data currently exist from the Portland Harbor site that will be helpful and cost effective to use to further assess injury of natural resources at the site. Additional studies will be needed to better quantify injury and service losses for some resources, but these data can be obtained at reasonable costs.
- 5) Response actions from Superfund remedial activities carried out or planned do not or will not sufficiently remedy the injury to natural resources without further action The trustees expect the remedial actions at the Portland Harbor site will, to a certain extent, minimize or

eliminate exposure to hazardous substances. The full extent of such impact cannot be assessed until the remedial action is selected by EPA. However, even at this stage it is evident that the direction of the remedial investigation/feasibility study is not toward full restoration of likely injuries, and will not address lost services of resources which have been ongoing since the enactment of CERCLA. Thus, additional restoration, replacement, and rehabilitation of natural resources will ultimately be necessary.

Notice is further given that the Trustees intend to implement a phased approach to natural resource damage assessment by first assessing natural resource injuries caused by hazardous substances released at Portland Harbor. You and the other PRPs are invited to fully fund this assessment, and to participate in the development of the type and scope of the assessment, and in the performance of the assessment as agreed to by the Trustee Council.

Your written response regarding the role you wish to take in the funding and resulting participation in this assessment is requested within 30 days of this Notice. The Trustee Council will not proceed with development of the Injury Assessment Plan until after expiration of this 30-day period. Written responses should be provided to the following:
